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## Easy Slipper Clog - Ladies size 8

### Materials

Hooks 3.5 and 6 mm

Yarn Super Bulky 6

8 oz / 227 g

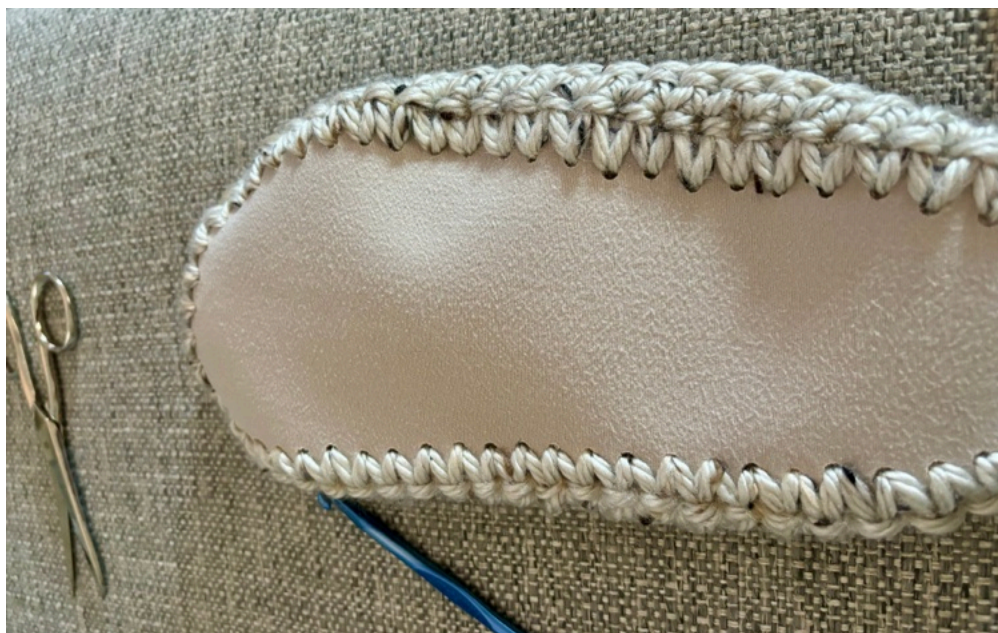
100 - 110 yards

3.5 mm leather hole  
punch

Faux Shearling rug

Paper for tracing foot / sole template, pencil, scissors

Pattern shows Lion Brand Hometown Yarn, Aspen Tweed Colour. 94% Acrylic / 6% Rayon. Machine washable. Gauge 6.6 st/8rows in 4x4 square. Stated yarn lengths are for guidance only. The key to crochet a specific size is a lot about the crochet style/hands/skills, rather than the size of hook. Therefore, we will recommend a range of hook sizes.

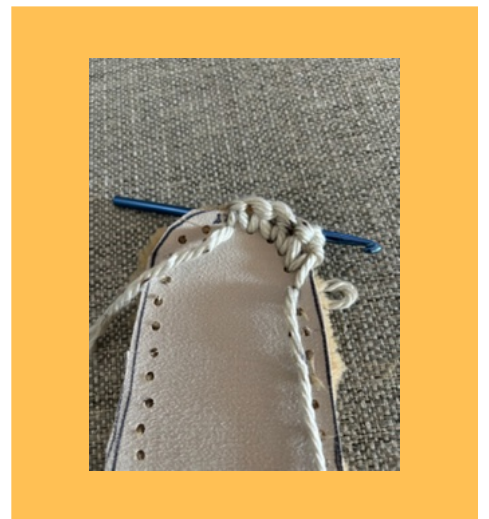
## Abbreviations and Definitions

Abbreviations	Definition
sc	Single crochet stitch,
st	Stitch
Hdc	Half double crochet stitch
DC	Double crochet stitch
ss	Slip stitch
Ch	Chain stitch
Sc2tog	Decrease (2 single crochet together)
(##)	At the end of a line indicates the total number of stitches
[#]	Notes number of stitches that vary for repeats

## Sole




We used an [IKEA](#) faux shearling rug to create our soles, but there are many pre-made soles you can readily purchase. If you would like to make your own soles, you can use a flip flop or shoe to trace a pattern onto paper, cut out the pattern and mark the holes. This pattern is for ladies size 8, (10.5" long x 5" wide) which requires 55 holes around the sole.

Row	Attaching soles to the yarn
1	<p>Use a 3.5 hook so it fits the hole, With the tail on the leather side, insert hook from the fleece side in the starting hole (at the heel of the slipper), and pull a loop of yarn through to the fleece side. Ch.1</p> <p>Insert the hook into the next hole and pull another loop through (2 loops on hook). Wrap yarn again and pull through both loops to create a single crochet stitch. Continue around the sole and at the end insert your hook back into the first hole and sc. ss to connect and ch.1</p> <p>Be careful not to work tightly on this row or the sole will warp/curl.</p>
2	<p>sc around the sole. ss and tie off.</p> <p>If you are worried about sloppy floors, we purchased a rug/fabric spray-on at the fabric store that you can use on your soles.</p>



Upper

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Row	Step-by-Step
1	<p>Start in middle of the toe end of the sole and Count 4 stitches each side of the middle. Keep your tension fairly tight using a 6mm hook.</p> <p>Starting at one end - chain 1 and sc x 8 stitches. Weave in the tail by holding it alongside to crochet it in. If you are left-handed like me, work to the right. Right-handed, work left.</p> <p>Following the 8th stitch, sc + 2 more into the sole, turn</p> 
2	<p>Begin by skipping first stitch and starting in the 2nd - then sc to end of row = 9 stitches and again add 2 more sc into sole (11)</p>  <p>Caption: Row 3 - 2nd stitch to start</p>
3	<p>Always begin each row the same way (2nd stitch) and sc to end of row = 10 + 3 more sc into the sole as shown below</p> 
4 - 6	<p>Row 4 - repeat row 3 (14)</p> <p>Row 5 - repeat (16)</p> <p>Row 6 - repeat (18)</p>



Row 7 - sc, sc2tog, sc x 14 + 3 more sc into the sole (19)

Row 8 - repeat (20)



7 - 8

Depending on your foot width, you can adjust by increasing / decreasing the # of stitches in a row. 20 stitches results in an approx. 5" width.

Row 9 - sc x 2, sc2tog, sc x 14, sc2tog, + 2 into,sole (20)

Row 10 - sc x 3, sc2tog, sc x 12, sc2tog + 3 (20)

Row 11 - sc x 4, sc2tog, sc x 10, sc2tog, sc + 3 (20)

Row 12 - sc x 5, sc2tog, sc x 8, sc2tog, sc x2 + 3 (20)

Row 13 - sc x 6, sc2tog, sc x 6, sc2tog, sc x 3 + 3 (20)

Row 14 - sc x 7, sc2tog, sc x 4, sc2tog, sc x 4 + 3 (20)

Row 15 - sc x 8, sc2tog, sc x 2, sc2tog, sc x 5 + 3 (20)

9 - 15



sc x 9, sc2tog, sc x9 + 3 into the sole AND a 4th slip stitch (ss)into the sole (22)

16



sc into 2nd st, then Hdc next 4, then sc x 4, sc2tog, sc x 2, sc2tog, sc x 4, then Hdc next 4, sc, AND then Hdc x 15 around the back of the slipper into the sole

17



DC x 2, Hdc x 2, sc x4, ss x 8 (or you can continue to sc pending your preference / fit against ankle), sc x 4, Hdc x 2, DC x 2 AND then continue to Hdc around the back / heel and end with a slip stitch to tie off. Weave in tail.

This last row can also highlight design with a colour change.
